Announcement of a Faculty Position #8898

**Assistant Professor, Instructional Technology
Department of Secondary Education**

The University of South Florida is a national research university with over 45,000 students and has one of the largest, most highly regarded urban Colleges of Education in the country. Approximately 4,500 students are enrolled in the College in bachelor's, master's, Ph.D., Ed.D., and Ed.S. degree programs. The College is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), and is rated in the top 20% of graduate schools of education in *US News and World Report*. The College contributed significantly to the over \$310 million in external funding generated during 2005-06 by the University of South Florida, and to the University's national and international agenda through research, teaching, and engagement with the schools/community. It is housed in a \$22 million state-of-the-art wireless education facility.

The Instructional Technology Program within the Department of Secondary Education is a well-established and rapidly growing academic unit that currently offers the M.Ed, Ed.S, and Ph.D. degrees, as well as graduate certificates and a college-wide undergraduate service course. POSITION:

Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology, College of Education, Department of Secondary Education; 9-month, tenure track, effective - August 6, 2008. Major responsibilities include teaching both traditional and online undergraduate and graduate courses dealing with instructional design, development and research as applied to PK-12 education; to advise and mentor graduate students; to conduct a program of scholarly research; to actively pursue external funding; and to perform service to the university, the community, and the profession.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Earned doctorate with a major in Educational Technology, Instructional Technology, Instructional Systems Design, or related field.
2. Successful experience as a PK-12 teacher
3. Coursework and expertise in PK-12 technology infusion, instructional design, instructional technology research, and development & evaluation of instructional media and methods
4. Evidence of or established potential for substantial scholarly productivity in the area of Instructional Technology research.
5. Evidence of effective teaching, in both traditional and online formats

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

6. Successful teaching experience in a graduate-level instructional technology program
7. Refereed, research publications and presentations in national/international venues
8. Evidence of or established potential for substantial scholarly productivity in the area of PK-12 technology infusion
9. Successful experience or demonstrated potential for serving on thesis/dissertation committees
10. Evidence of collaborative research with colleagues in school districts or comparable settings
11. Ability to teach courses in technology project management, web programming and/or design, distance education, digital video production, learning theory within the context of instructional design, and instructional technology research methods.
12. Successful experience or demonstrated potential for pursuit of external funding
13. Commitment to support scholarship on issues of diversity
